DANIEL NAUDE: A DECADE OF SEEING

13 February – 2 March 2019

Everard Read London is pleased to present *A Decade of Seeing* by acclaimed South African photographer, Daniel Naudé.

Over the past decade, Naudé has practised capturing and perfecting moments of stillness in nature.

This exhibition encompasses a critical selection of works from his recent projects: Animal Farm

(2007-2012), Sightings of the Sacred: Cattle in Uganda, Madagascar and India (2012-2014), Cattle of

the Ages – Ankole cattle in South Africa - a project with South African President, Cyril Ramaphosa

(2017) as well as his newest works of Xhosa cattle on the shore of the Eastern Cape, South Africa.

From his early encounters with stray dogs in Africa, to his majestic images of Ankole cattle in Uganda

and the Zebu cattle in Madagascar, Naudé manages to create the impression of time standing still.

His portraits are also an attempt to create an enduring memory of what humanity is slowly and

surely destroying.

Martin Barnes, senior curator of photography at the Victoria & Albert Museum, London, observes

that each of Naudé's photographs is "a shared moment in time, one in which the animal and the

human seem at once named and yet nameless, specific and yet universal. There is a mutual "now-

ness" to this collection of arresting human-animal gazes, mediated by the camera. In total, they read

like a remarkable series of ecstatic, intensified meeting points in which we query what it means to

be alive, locked in momentary register with another sentient being."

Naudé explains: "My decision to take a particular image of an animal emerges from a reciprocity

between us, a singular moment in which my presence and that of the animal merge. This moment is

not stage-managed The animal's bearing cannot be arranged or controlled. It does not pose;

there is no pretence or acting Despite this, or perhaps because of it, it is possible to capture

character, to create portraits of individuals rather than records of perfect specimens."

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Naudé has exhibited widely, including at Everard Read and Stevenson galleries in South Africa, the Photographers' Gallery in London and at the J. Paul Getty Museum in Los Angeles. Festivals in which he has participated include La Gacilly Photo Festival (Baden, 2018 and 2017), the Lyon Biennale (2015), Lagos Photo (2011) and Bamako Biennale (2011).

Naudé's work is included in public and private collections in the UK, Europe, South Africa and the US, including the J. Paul Getty Museum. This is Naudé's first solo exhibition with Everard Read London and his third solo show with the Everard Read group.

About Daniel Naudé

(b.1984, Cape Town, South Africa)

Naudé was born in 1984 in Cape Town, where he continues to live and work. He graduated with a BA

Visual Arts Honours degree from the University of Stellenbosch in 2007.

Daniel Naudé first found inspiration for his striking photographs of animals during a road trip

through the South African desert in 2006. Since then, he has continued to focus on the ancient breed

of wild Africanis dogs, capturing the animals in regal portraits. While they appear staged, the images

are actually the result of tremendous patience, careful timing, and digital techniques, which the

artist deploys to capture a charged moment of human-animal interaction. Since his early

photographs of dogs, the artist has continued to explore the South African countryside and rural

landscapes further afield in India and Mozambique, capturing animals, both domesticated and wild.

Naudé has had solo exhibitions at Everard Read Johannesburg and Cape Town, Stevenson Galleries

in South Africa and has showed selected photographs from Animal Farm in the print room at The

Photographers' Gallery in London in 2013.

Naudé's first book, Animal Farm, was published by Prestel in 2012, followed by Sightings of the

Sacred: Cattle in India, Uganda and Madagascar in 2016, also by Prestel. Naudé took part in the 2011

residency programme at Anderson Ranch in Aspen, Colorado.
