Everard Read London presents Shany Van den Berg: *Dream Pond* 18 October – 9 November

Everard Read London is pleased to present *Dream Pond*, an exhibition of paintings and drawings by South African artist, Shany Van den Berg.

Van den Berg's practice centres on contemporary portraiture and figurative work, with an underlying theme of womanhood. Her ethereal oil paintings evoke the mood and texture of Old Master paintings, conveying emotions, moods and ideas through meticulous attention to detail, an extraordinary facility with paint and subtle symbolism.

A sense of layering pervades Van den Berg's works, in the imagery itself and through her painterly process. Surfaces are built up with subtle layering, shadows are imbued with texture and skins exude an almost viscous sheen. Although unmistakably feminine, some of Van den Berg's forms evoke a sense of animalism through their attenuated bone structure, and an underlying sexuality pervades many of the forms. They suggest recognition, confirmation and the bittersweet knowledge of love, loss and letting go.

For this first solo exhibition at Everard Read London, Van den Berg has created a body of work inspired by water as a life force. Developed over the course of the past year, these works reflect the artist's journey of self-discovery through the seasonal cycles. At their heart are the water lilies, rising up from muddy waters; a powerful metaphor for rebirth.

Van den Berg's paintings have a sensual and ethereal quality, but they also evoke a sense of calm and a quiet strength. They reveal a woman deeply attuned to the beauty and power of nature and a profound gratitude for the gifts that the natural world offers us. With their petals, floating foliage and shimmering reflections, these works are permeated by an overwhelming sense of new life.

Van den Berg observes, "As the seasons changed, I watched the last of the lilies and their green pads gradually grow smaller and become dormant. This left an emptiness in the ponds, but an abundance of reflections on the liquid surface; the nearby oak tree whose skeletal fingers reached out over the water ... as well as my own face. "

Van den Berg has worked as a full-time artist for almost thirty years. Her practice includes painting on board, linen and found objects, drawing, sculpture, site specific installations, mixed media, threedimensional work as well as poetry and music. This is her sixth solo exhibition with Everard Read Galleries.

About Shany Van den Berg

(b. 1958 Riversdale, South Africa)

Shany van den Berg's multifaceted practice is centred around the notions of identity in contemporary portraiture and figurative work as well as sculpture and conceptual collagebased objects that complete a diverse and often performative artistic practice. Underpinning her work are the ever-present themes of matriarchy, womanhood and the passage of time for humanity.

Van den Berg's ethereal oil paintings evoke the mood and texture of Old Master paintings, conveying complex emotions, moods and ideas through exacting attention to detail, an extraordinary facility with paint, and subtle symbolism. Repetition across surfaces are built up in swathes, layered onto the board, linen and found objects. Shadows are imbued with texture and 'skins' that exude an almost viscous evocative sheen. Forms can conjure a sense of animalism through their attenuated bone structure, and an underlying but subtle sexuality pervades many of the forms.

Unmistakably feminine, many narratives suggest recognition, confirmation and the bittersweet knowledge of love, loss and letting go. Her portraiture is most often of women whose features morph into a composite of the artist and her loved ones, serving as portals to narratives of love, sacrifice, and ultimately transcendence.

Ven den Berg's work also explores and interrogates the critical contemporary themes of identity, family and connectedness to the world around us through multimedia expressions of drawings, paintings, collages and sculptural forms. There she reconstitutes her stream of consciousness - as both fable and history. This binds together as a layered 'map' - both of her interior solitary landscapes and of more universal concerns – the passing of time as we all journey through life. This poignantly serves to remind us that we are alone but also inescapably part of one human race.

Van den Berg has worked as a full-time artist for almost thirty years, initially as a ceramicist. Her practice includes painting, drawing, sculpture, site specific installations, mixed media, three-dimensional work as well as poetry, performance, video and music.

Van den Berg's work is represented in private collections in the UK, South Africa, Europe and the USA.
