

For her first solo exhibition at Everard Read London, South African artist, Shany Van den Berg, presents *Dream Pond*, a new body of work inspired by water as a life force. Created over the course of the past year, these works reflect the artist's journey of self-discovery through the seasonal cycles. At their heart are the water lilies, rising up from muddy waters; a powerful metaphor for rebirth. Van den Berg's paintings have a sensual and ethereal quality, but they also evoke a sense of calm and a quiet strength. They reveal a woman deeply attuned to the beauty and power of nature and a profound gratitude for the gifts that the natural world offers us. Through the layers of petals, floating foliage and shimmering reflections, these works are permeated by an overwhelming sense of new life.



DREAM POND

During the summer of 2019, I was fortunate to swim in natural lily ponds in the Western Cape, South Africa where the indigenous blue water lilies were in full bloom. I interacted with the ponds, felt the water, the lilies and their leaves, stems and the mud against my skin, documenting their growth and colours.

My memories of water and lilies, from childhood to present day, has driven my practice conceptually in this body of work. I have found myself for days in the Stellenbosch Botanical Gardens, a small, quiet gem with lily ponds and quite near where I live and work. This location initiated painterly and drawing-based experiments and research over the past two years. In essence, it served in real time to manifest my own lilies and water spirits through documenting my thoughts as they were mirrored back to me by the watery reflections. Originally the memory of a devastating house fire 26 years ago, had given way to my own phoenix, rising out of the ashes, and to creative rebirths. This most recent rebirth was through the water and waterlilies as it started to symbolically wash through me bringing new understanding and artistic growth.

The water lily is one of the first plants that children become familiar with in fairy tales. I was reminded of these stories, like the indigenous blue waterlily (*Kaaimans-blom*) in South Africa and the myth around it as a water spirit, half-human and half-fish.

These whispers from a lily pond evolved into the *Dream Pond*. Walking through the lilies, feeling them and the water emotionally,

Thinking and reading about water lily myths, the nymphs, naiads and goddesses, I found myself searching, taking photos underwater in the ponds for the essence of their colours and textures and through this, I felt and heard their voices and stories. I found myself cutting and releasing the drowned, entangled flowers that never got a chance to bloom. Back home I dissected these lilies, searching inside for answers and feelings – ultimately for an insight into my own thoughts and directions.

The cycle of growth and the underwater world is a metaphor for our lives in this world of diversity, profoundly increasingly affected by a scarcity of water and by pollution. As the seasons changed, I was watching the last of the lilies and their green pads that gradually became smaller and went dormant. This left an emptiness in the ponds, but an abundance of reflections on the liquid surface, such as the nearby oak tree whose skeletal fingers reached out over the water.

The emptiness gave me space for creation and the mirroring of my own musings and experiments. It served as a haunting metaphor, a reminder of the life underneath that had gone into a deep comatose sleep. It remains evocatively quiescent, all the while as the fascinating reflections skim across the water ... the plants, birds, blue skies, the clouds as well as other visitors and my own face.




Swimming in the Pond Towards Herself oil on board 90 x 70 cm

























SHANY VAN DEN BERG

Shany van den Berg's multifaceted practice is centred around notions of identity in contemporary portraiture and figurative work as well as sculpture and conceptual collage-based objects that complete a diverse and often performative artistic practice. Underpinning her work are the ever-present themes of matriarchy, womanhood and the passage of time for humanity.


Van den Berg's ethereal oil paintings evoke the mood and texture of Old Master paintings, conveying complex emotions, moods and ideas through exacting attention to detail, an extraordinary facility with paint, and subtle symbolism. Repetition across surfaces are built up in swathes, layered onto the board, linen and found objects. Shadows are imbued with texture and 'skins' that exude an almost viscous evocative sheen. Forms can conjure a sense of animalism through their attenuated bone structure, and an underlying but subtle sexuality pervades many of the forms.

Unmistakably feminine, many narratives suggest recognition, confirmation and the bitter-sweet knowledge of love, loss and letting go. Her portraiture is most often of women whose features morph into a composite of the artist and her loved ones, serving as portals to narratives of love, sacrifice, and ultimately transcendence.

Ven den Berg's work also explores and interrogates the critical contemporary themes of identity, family and connectedness to the world around us through multimedia expressions of drawings, paintings, collages and sculptural forms. There she reconstitutes her stream of consciousness – as both fable and history. This binds together as a layered 'map' – both of her interior solitary landscapes and of more universal concerns – the passing of time as we all journey through life. This poignantly serves to remind us that we are alone but also inescapably part of one human race.

Van den Berg has worked as a full-time artist for almost thirty years, initially as a ceramicist. Her practice includes painting, drawing, sculpture, site specific installations, mixed media, three-dimensional work as well as poetry, performance, video and music.

Van den Berg's work is represented in private collections in the UK, South Africa, France, Germany, Hong Kong, Luxembourg, Cayman Islands and the U.S.A.


