Everard Read London presents an exhibition of new works on paper by South African artist, Phillemon Hlungwani. One of South Africa's most accomplished contemporary artists, Hlungwani is known for his large-scale, charcoal drawings depicting scenes from rural life which powerfully convey a sense of community.

This exhibition comprises 18 new works and speaks to the artist's deep love and respect for his people and in particular, the women, who are the life-giving force in communities across South Africa. Using proverbs in his mother tongue, xiTsonga, as titles, the works communicate an essential moral idea, conveying how members of a community are sustaining (or betraying) the values of its people.

With this new body of work, Hlungwani revisits the village of his birth, where his mother continues to reside. It is a modest village, indistinguishable from so many others in rural Limpopo Province, and indeed from countless others in South Africa and the rest of the continent. It is however the wellspring of Hlungwani's creativity; it serves both as his

muse and a refuge to which he returns from Johannesburg for inspiration and renewal.

Hlungwani's subject matter is familiar to us – rural children with bare feet, the village matriarchs swathed in blankets, and young mothers balancing loads on their heads. These all-too familiar scenes have become memes for rural poverty, but, as always with Hlungwani's work, he seeks to remind us that even the poorest amongst us lead complex and rich inner lives.

Hlungwani's protagonists may live in starkly different environments to our own, but like us all, they have dreams, hopes and aspirations. They too have experienced joy, love, loss, and deep sadness. It is these universal themes in Hlungwani's work that touch us deeply. With a clear and unsentimental eye, the artist reveals, through the daily life of an unremarkable village, our shared humanity and connectedness.

This is Phillemon Hlungwani's second solo presentation with Everard Read London and his ninth with the Everard Read group.

PHILLEMON HLUNGWANI b. 1975, Thomo Village, Limpopo Province, South Africa



Phillemon Hlungwani was born in Thomo Village, Giyani, in the Limpopo Province. He attended the local village schools, where he developed his skills under the guidance of his art teacher, and mentors Muxe Moses Mthombeni and Queen Mtileni. Hlungwani studied at the Johannesburg Art Foundation before studying printmaking under the mentorship of Kim Berman, the late Nhlahla Xaba and Osiah Masukameng at the Artist Proof Studio. Hlungwani later completed a teacher's training course in Art at the WITS School of Art. He has since been based at the Artist Proof Studio, where he has facilitated classes, been a unit manager for papermaking and was the coordinator for community outreach and special projects at the studio. He has also worked in a range of advisory and mentoring

projects. Sponsored by the prestigious Ampersand Foundation Fellowship, Hlungwani completed an extensive study tour of printmaking studios in the United States. In addition to his drawing and graphic work, Hlungwani has completed and facilitated many murals, including at the Standard Bank Art Gallery (for the Picasso in Africa exhibition) and a mural for Bell Dewar and Hall. He has been commissioned by the Johannesburg Development Agencies, MTN and the South African Governmental offices.

Awards include the King Korn competition (2000 and 2001) and the SABC Radio Station Munghana Lonene FM Log Design Award (2003). He was a finalist for the Absa Gallery competition in 2001, 2002 and 2009.
