BEARING WITNESS

Bearing Witness, a new collection of paintings by South African artist, Lorienne Lotz, speaks to the spaces in between, it speaks to our paradoxes, it speaks to both tenderness and brutality, and to our humour and terror.

Throughout her artistic practice, Lotz has explored oppression as a central theme, with the absurdity of the human condition forming the broader framework of her work. Her paintings intricately intertwine the political with the personal, reflecting the complexities and contradictions of our existence.

For Lotz, the world around us mirrors the deep shadows within us — the personal struggles we face with the imbalances, duplicities, and forces that shape our nature. As she explains, 'The struggle to find equilibrium between opposing forces, whether in the socio-political realm or within myself, becomes the narrative that fuels my work.' Ultimately, Lotz acknowledges that there is no escaping our true selves or the ironies that arise from our deepest narratives.

Idiomatic expressions – rich in absurdity and vivid imagery – often serve as the starting point for her work. She describes these expressions brought to her attention by an unseen force, almost with prescience or foreknowledge, as they align with both world events and personal experiences, deepening the meaning of the work and guiding its completion.

For Lotz, referencing art history within her work reveals the reverberations through time, connecting the past to the present while highlighting the timeless nature of human emotions and conflicts. These polarities mirror her working process, where she navigates the delicate balance between abstraction and figuration. The discordant placement of images is a tool she uses to expose inherent paradoxes and evoke universal pathos. As she describes it, 'It becomes a dance, a hovering, where contradictions are questioned, and there is a search for interconnectedness and lyricism.'

In a world rife with devastating conflicts that reflect the wars within, Lotz says, 'I continue to challenge my artistic process by giving authority to the pressing questions of our time and to the horror and beauty of our very humanness'.

This is Lorienne Lotz's second solo exhibition with the London gallery.

LORIENNE LOTZ

Born in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe, Lorienne Lotz currently lives in Cape Town. She completed a post-graduate Diploma in Fine Art at Michaelis UCT (2013) and was awarded a Sasol New Signatures Merit Award (2014). Lotz studied in the 1980s under Bill Ainslie at the Johannesburg Art Foundation. Since 2008, the annual intensive Rosenclaire workshops in Italy and South Africa (run by duo Rose Shakinovsky and Claire Gavronsky) as well as the Astar process and painting sessions with Lindy Solomon are influences which have been instrumental in forging Lotz's deeply intuitive material process and awareness of a formal language. Her work is held locally and internationally in private collections.
